**SPIDS**

From time to time residents and motorists will see Speed Indicator Devices (SPIDs) in operation in our Village.

The purpose of these devices is to encourage motorists to observe the 30mph speed limit. If the motorist sees a smiling face then they are within the 30mph limit but if the motorist is shown a grumpy face then they are driving in excess of the speed limit.

The SPIDs also record the speeds of vehicles and the statistics are used to determine the frequency of visits of the Mobile Speed Camera Unit to the Village.

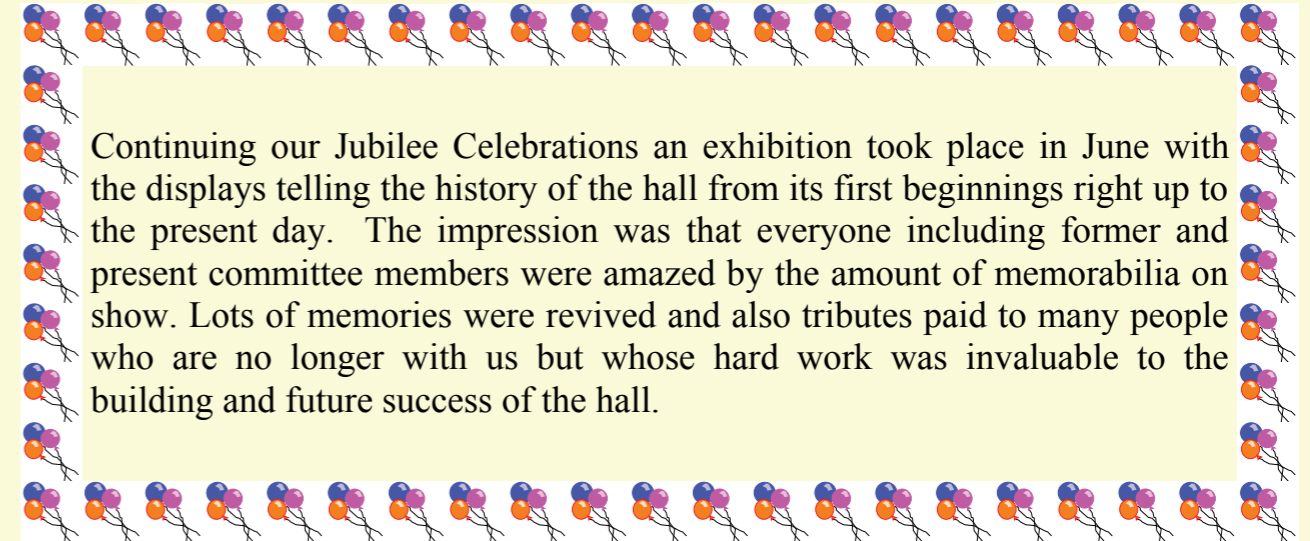
*If motorists keep within the 30mph speed limit the Police Speed Camera will not need to visit Hutton too regularly.*
